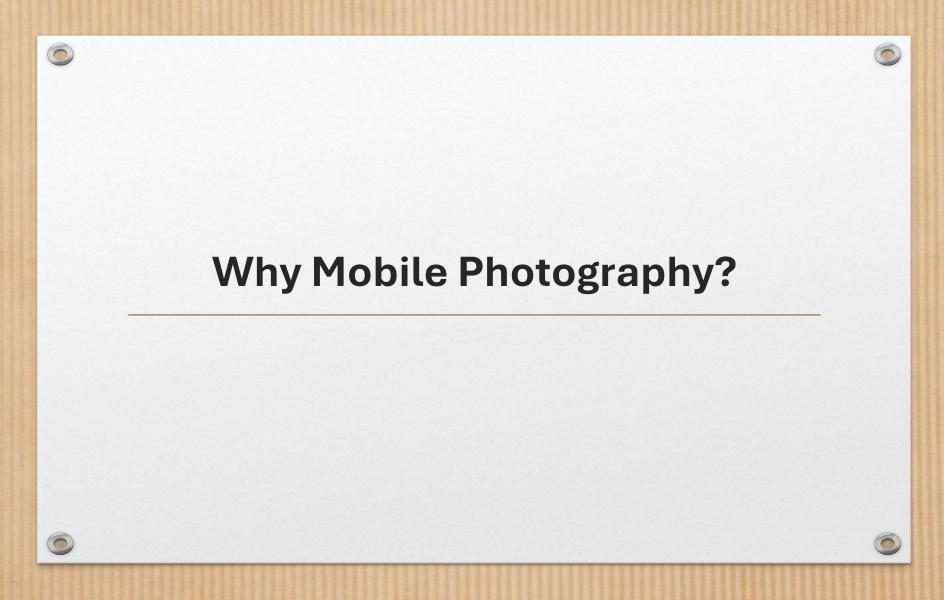

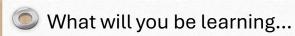

**Avoid Merger and Distracting Background at all cost!** 





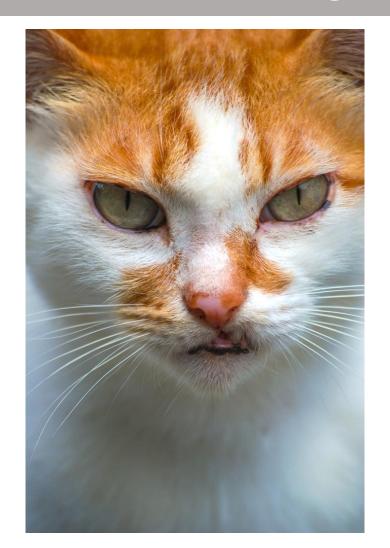

Don't use zoom. Walk to your subject instead!





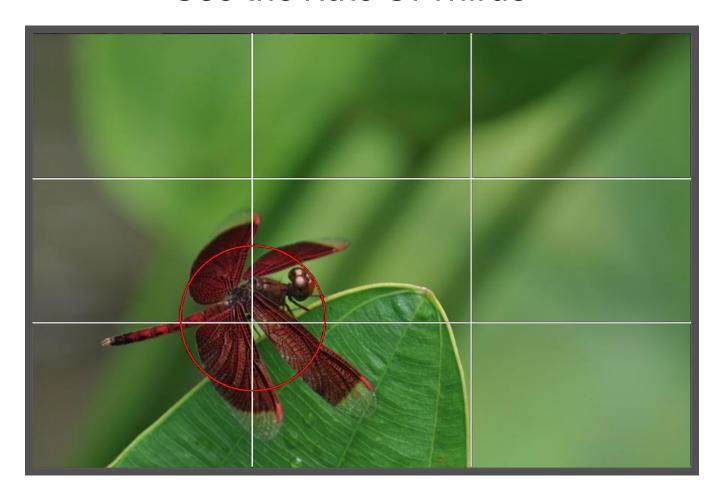

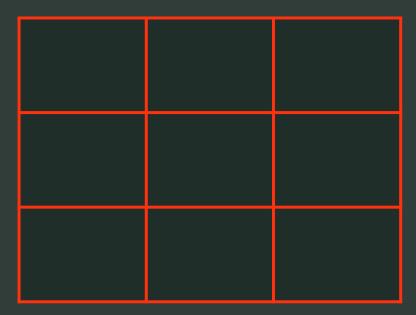


#### Use the Rule Of Thirds

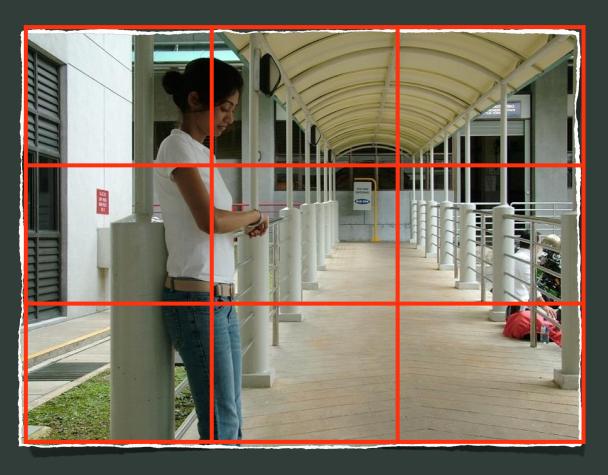


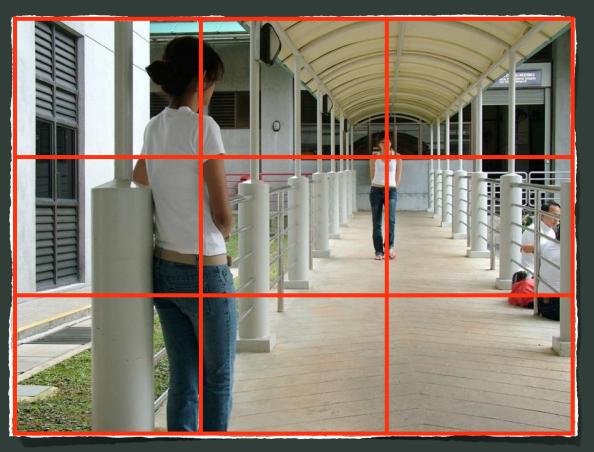
### Rule of Thirds

Breaking the frame into thirds tends to create less symmetrical and more active compositions.









#### Headroom

...the space between the top of the frame and the top of the person's head

### Normal Headroom



### Too much headroom



## Not enough headroom

### ~ use Converging lines (Vanishing Point)



#### **Use Converging Lines**

Converging lines can form a vanishing point in the scene creating depth, especially with wide angle lens. It also helps drawing the viewer's eye into the scene.
